- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent
- Minimum age: 18 years
- Language proficiency (CLB Level 6 or IELTS 5.5 overall or equivalent)
- Mechanical aptitude and interest in heavy vehicle service
- Prior experience in auto or truck maintenance (recommended but not required)
