#### **Program Overview**

The **NACC Personal Support Worker (PSW)** program prepares graduates to provide:

- supportive care to individuals by assisting them with their activities of daily living,
- clients experiencing cognitive impairment, physical disability, and mental health challenges.
- personal care such as dressing, personal hygiene, mobility and other routine activities of living
- Comply with Regulated Health Professions Act,
- home management (shopping, cleaning and meal preparation, family responsibilities (care giving to children assisting with social and recreational activities).
- PSW provide safety and well-being sensitivity and respect for those in their care.
- The attitude, abilities and approach of the PSW are critical to the well-being and health of the people they support.



## Graduates may find employment in a variety of care settings including:

- Long-term care facilities
- Home care services giving care to clients living in their own homes in the community
- Supportive housing settings including senior's apartments and retirement homes
- Group homes
- Hospitals
- Adult day programs
- Educational facilities



#### **Job Responsibilities**

- Co-operates with all members of the health team
- Promotes safety and works in a safe manner
- · Assists with walking, movement and positioning
- Assists with mechanical and physical lifts and/or transfers
- Assists with personal care, personal hygiene, dressing, including laundry related tasks
- Assists with meal preparation, grocery shopping, feeding, dietary planning, food handling
- · Answers call bells
- Checks and records vital signs
- Teaches life skills
- Assists with range of motion exercise and other rehabilitative measures
- Practices universal precautions and maintains a clean working environment
- Provides emotional and social support services to carereceivers and their families
- Is aware of common allergies and related first aid measures
- Works as a supportive care worker for palliative care and hospice patients
- Observes and reports clinical and treatment findings, behavioural changes and changes in ongoing conditions.
- · Maintains records, documents procedures

#### **Admission Requirements**

- 18 years of age or older.
- Secondary school diploma or equivalent.
- · Live online or In-person interview.
- IELTS of 6 or PTE or TOEFL result to prove English proficiency
- Post Secondary diploma, degree with a minimum GPA of 60% (if applicable)
- All certificates or degrees earned from another country must be assessed by any of the following institutions to determine Canadian equivalency:
